ELUL - A MONTH OF SPIRITUAL PREPARATION

"Returning Home: A Clergy Series for the Days of Preparation"

7:00–8:15 pm | Led by CMO Clergy

Monday, August 3 - Rabbi Muhlbaum - "I Seek Your Face: Exploring Psalm 27"

Throughout the month of Elul, it is traditional to recite Psalm 27 daily. This text is a spiritual companion for the season, inviting us into reflection, courage, and the work of returning. Join Rabbi Muhlbaum for a close reading of this psalm, where we'll uncover its literary artistry and enduring spiritual wisdom. Whether you've recited these words before or are encountering them anew, you'll discover fresh insights to carry with you into the Holy Day season.

Monday, August 10 – Rabbi Caruso - "The Complexities of Forgiveness"

A hallmark of the High Holy Days is the practice of "Teshuvah," a complex word that evokes return, renewal, and repentance. During the Days of Awe, our tradition charges us to let go of lasting hurts, with hopes that others will do the same with respect to our own offenses, but finding forgiveness is easier in theory than in practice! Join Rabbi Caruso for a look through rabbinic and modern texts to examine the Jewish way towards forgiveness.

Monday, August 17 – Rabbi Klein - "Why Are We Here? Thoughts of Renewal for the High Holidays"

If you are like Rabbi Klein, you often get up in the morning ready to go about your day. We look at our calendars, and they tell us what to do, when to do it, and sometimes, how to do it. But why are we doing what we are about to do? What values and purposes animate the activities of our lives? The High Holidays offer us an opportunity to think about meaning ... and the meaning of our lives—and whether our calendars are sufficiently aligned with what we think we ought to be doing.

Monday, August 24 – Rabbi Dadoun - "The Story We Tell Ourselves"

We all carry a story about who we are—what we're capable of, and what we're stuck with. But Elul exists precisely to ask: "Is that story true, or just familiar?"

The spies saw the same land and told two different stories. Which story are you telling? Join Rabbi Dadoun for an Elul class on the narratives we carry, the change we're capable of, and a guided practice for writing the year you actually want—before the gates of the new year open.

Sunday, August 30 – 10:00 am – 12:00 pm - Renewed Hearts and Round Challot - An Intergenerational Challah Baking Event

Gather with family and friends for an intergenerational challah bake celebrating one of Rosh Hashanah's sweetest traditions. Together, we'll shape round challot, reflecting on how their circular form reminds us that the Jewish year moves not in a straight line, but in cycles of return, growth, and renewal.

Key Changes for This Year

- The Yom Kippur Yizkor service in the Silver Sanctuary at MPAC (September 21) will be at 1:00 pm—earlier than in previous years and will follow Yom Kippur morning worship in the Silver Sanctuary.
- Following the Yom Kippur Yizkor service in Beachwood, the remainder of CMO worship and programs will occur solely in the Silver Sanctuary at MPAC.
- There will be two Family Services held on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur mornings: one at 10:00 am and a second identical service at 11:30 am.
- We will be offering bus services between the Beachwood and University Circle locations.

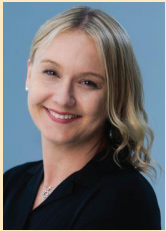

Gen X Group Gathering: Lake Erie Captains Game - Thursday, August 13, 7:00-9:00 pm

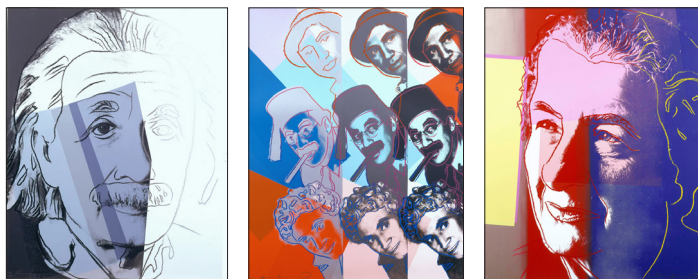

Andy Warhol: Ten Portraits of Jews of the Twentieth Century

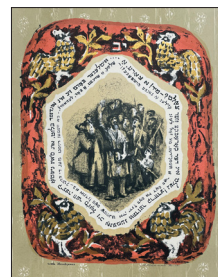
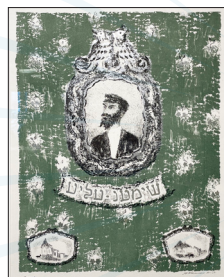
New exhibition, Chapel Corridor, August 2026-June 2027

Ten formidable portraits of ten formidable people: Andy Warhol's 1980 iconic series brings together some of the most influential Jewish figures of the last century, from Albert Einstein to the Marx Brothers. These portraits invite us to reflect on identity, legacy, and cultural impact through Warhol's unmistakable pop art lens.

Anatoly Kaplan: The Enchanted Tailor

Exhibition, Hartzmark Gallery, until October 11, 2026

Mishkan Or Museum is proud to present the extraordinary art of Anatoly Kaplan (1901-1980), one of the most important graphic artists and illustrators of Soviet Russia. *The Enchanted Tailor* is a series of lithographs created in the 1950s in the Soviet Union based on the story by Sholem Aleichem written in 1901. The series was a rare occurrence of Jewish culture openly presented to Soviet audiences. Through their magical beauty, the images elevate the absurdist humor of Sholem Aleichem's characters, while also subtly injecting a critique of Soviet reality under the radar of censorship.

Sholem Aleichem Enchanted Tailor Reading With Rabbi Muhlbaum - Sparks of Light

Join us in the Commons for a pre-Shabbat discussion of Sholem Aleichem's novella, *The Enchanted Tailor*, with Rabbi Muhlbaum.

This event is sponsored by the Hartzmark Library and the Mishkan Or Museum, in connection with the Museum's exhibition, *Anatoly Kaplan: The Enchanted Tailor, Sholem Aleichem in Soviet Graphics*.

In *The Enchanted Tailor* (1901; also translated as *The Haunted Tailor* or *The Bewitched Tailor*), Sholem Aleichem (1859-1916) offers a stylized folktale, the perfect subject for Kaplan's series of lithographs from the 1950s, a rare presentation of Jewish culture for Soviet audiences.

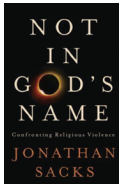
