Rabbi Nosanchuk, pictured here with his family, has been a visionary presence in our community, guiding generations through moments of joy, reflection, and renewal. As Founding Senior Rabbi of Congregation Mishkan Or, he helped bring our bold new congregation to life, supporting every stage of the exploration process and leading us with clarity, courage, and heart. His steady presence united two legacy congregations into one community grounded in shared values and a sense of purpose.

Rabbi Nosanchuk's impact has reached far beyond our walls. A past co-chair of the Greater Cleveland Congregations (GCC), he has been a tireless advocate for justice and human rights in every community he has served. Under his guidance, what was in 2010 a nascent merger between Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple and Chevrei Tikvah LGBTQ+ Chavurah, became one community uniquely committed to affirmation and inclusion. As a gifted provider of pastoral care, he has helped thousands of people at Mishkan Or and at earlier at Fairmount Temple and congregations served in Reston, Virginia, and Baltimore, Maryland.

A steadfast supporter of Israel, he has consistently spoken up for Israelis affected by terror and further shown commitment by leading multiple trips of congregants to see Israel and trips for Muslim and Christian leaders to join Rabbis in Israel and the Palestinian Territories.

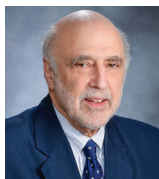

It is clear: Rabbi Nosanchuk strives to be a "rabbi's rabbi," always present for clergy teammates and colleagues with sound advice and counsel. Through his visionary leadership, he has built unity and continuity into the commitments of Congregation Mishkan Or—building upon the historic values of our legacy congregations, such as the pursuit of social justice, inclusion, and relating to all human beings as having infinite worth.

He has long referred to mentoring young people as the "soul" of his rabbinate and has modeled such work with students and young people who interact with our synagogue, with Jewish camps and youth activities.

Even when he faced a Stage IV metastatic cancer diagnosis in 2019, he showed extraordinary courage and grace to the community, becoming a symbol of faith and resilience and to all who know him, and raising awareness on cancer prevention and funds for research to improve treatment and quality of life for people with cancer.

His achieving remission in May, 2024, prompted Rabbi Nosanchuk's decision to retire from serving as a full-time rabbi, to savor what he calls his "bonus time" and pursue health and strength. He inspires us to live our values boldly and sustain the community he helped us create.

Finally, we anticipate gathering again on April 26, 2026, for a celebratory evening to honor Rabbi Nosanchuk's career and his extraordinary contributions to both Mishkan Or and the Cleveland Jewish community.
