MEMBER SECURITY BADGE PICK UP:

Every adult member attending Mishkan Or Services will be required to wear a name badge. These name badges can be picked up at Mishkan Or during hours when the building is open, including before Shabbat Services and other programs.

This name badge is not your "ticket" to services.

NEW: HIGH HOLY DAY SERVICES RSVPS:

Members in Good Standing can begin registering for High Holy Day services through their ShulCloud accounts.

Members in good standing means having confirmed verbally or electronically for the 2025/26 year; paid membership in full or are making payments; or are establishing payment arrangements.

Allow extra time for traffic. To park in ADA-designated spots, a hanging tag must be visible, and additional ADA spots will be added for High Holy Days. Use dropoff lanes for closer access for those who may need it.

BABYSITTING:


